<u>Programmed</u> has worked with major oil and gas organisations to create a group training program called the <u>National Energy Technician Training Scheme (NETTS)</u>





There are 24 Priority Occupations on the Western Australian State Priority Occupation List. These are the occupations where we are currently experiencing the greatest skills shortage.

All the occupations in the #1 category require extensive expertise. The health industry shortages are for our most expert



health professionals, like surgeons although specialist nurses are in that group too.

Check Priority 2 occupations on the <u>State Priority Occupation List</u> to see which jobs are in most demand. If you choose an occupation with a high priority on the list, you will pay less for your vocational training in Western Australia.

## **Getting Into Medicine at Curtin in 2019**

From: David Cameron. Admissions Coordinator, Curtin Medical School | Faculty of Health Sciences

- <u>The StepUp list for 2019</u> has not yet been finalised. The schools that are on the list for 2019 will be those that are eligible for StepUp, eligible Equity applicants that don't receive StepUp will receive the Equity bonus points. StepUp and the bonus points on offer from the Curtin Medical School are separate schemes and a student is only eligible for one.
- Last year our MMI's consisted of 2 minutes of reading time and 6 minutes of answering time. Our MMI process is reviewed each year and subject to change for each intake.
- The lowest ATAR score offered for 2018 entry was 96.15.

- Only Rural applicants have different requirements for the UMAT, an indicative overall score of 150 (Indigenous applicants are not required to sit the test).
- Equity, general school leavers, course switchers and graduates are required to meet the standard UMAT requirements.
- Our inherent requirements are more around making students aware of the demanding nature of the course and to help students meet AHPRA registration standards, they do not form a basis for what we are looking for at interview.

Dr Jordan Bell, Lincoln College, North Adelaide recently identified these success factors for academic success of first year university students.

- Being part of the dominant racial group.
- Parental education level.
- High grades in high school
- Internal motivation to study
- Enjoy studying or your university course
- Those who spend more time studying and attend tutorials
- Higher academic self efficacy belief in their own ability to succeed
- Social support from parents, faculty, other students and high school best friends
- Those who can plan, manage tasks and time, set goals and persist
- Attending voluntary advisory sessions and first year seminars at uni
- Living in residential accommodation.



## Equity Research on why Aboriginal kids don't go to uni

Written by <u>Jenny Gore</u>, Professor of Education, <u>University of Newcastle</u> for <u>The Conversation</u> did research on Why Aboriginal Kids Don't Go to Uni. She found:

1. Indigenous children have the same career aspirations as non-Indigenous children.

Our research suggests that waiting until senior secondary school to talk to them about their career aspirations is far too late. (The same is true for non-Indigenous children.)

#### 2. High-achieving Indigenous children are less likely to want to go to university

Perhaps more startling, our research found that high-achieving Indigenous students were significantly less likely to want to go to university than their high-achieving non-Indigenous peers.

While 72% of non-Indigenous students in the top NAPLAN quartile aspired to go to university, only 43% of Indigenous students in the same quartile said they wanted to go.

Indigenous students remain vastly underrepresented in higher education in Australia. This research identified 6 key factors:

- 1. Cultural and geographic reasons
- 2. Social and racial isolation
- 3. First -in-family
- 4. Pathways, costs and financial support
- 5. No obvious benefit
- 6. Distrust of government institutions



## **Impact on ATAR of University in Schools Programs**

I have heard from teachers at four schools who are concerned about the impact on ATAR of university programs that are being introduced to schools and wondering if others are also concerned.

Thoughts from schools include:

- Will ATAR survive?
- Decreasing motivation of students who think they will take an alternative pathway so don't need to work hard on ATAR.
- The increased focus on TAFE and potential for funding to decrease TAFE fees which will make VETiS more attractive.
- The long-term outcomes for alternative pathways students who haven't had the rigor of studying ATAR.
- Concerns about how project-based learning will fit into the school system.

The <u>Fogarty Foundation EdFutures Network</u> and at the <u>Curtin Learning Futures Network</u> are a good place to discuss these concerns. I encourage you to join both.

I have started to put together information on what university inputs to schools are available for the September newsletter and would welcome your input.

# Making Good Choices – Supporting students' transition from Year 12

Dr Jordan Bell's CDAA webinar was a great reminder of what we need to focus on at this time of year.

My key take outs were:

- Career advisors need to work more with parents.
- Social class is one of the most reliable and persistent predictors of educational attainment.
- Career issues are rarely considered by school students.



- Deciding on a preference for science V humanities is a useful first step.
- Lack of career guidance in years 9 and 10 is bad.
- Australian students who take a gap year risk not going back to study.
- Make clear what assistance is available to school leavers.

## **CDAA Winter Magazine**



The latest CDAA magazine has a great article by Jessica Pollard. Her organisation did research with 1000 students in NSW and some of her findings include:

- Allied health, sport and education roles dominated the most popular career options for students.
- Lawyer or solicitor was voted the most popular career option.
- There was a lack of STEM interest.
- Mathematician was the least popular role.
- There was a lack of interest in IT.
- There was a lack of interest in physical trades.

She found that many schools had less than \$1000 to spend on careers and that there was a lack of full time careers teachers in schools. These findings resonate with our Western Australian experience.

## **Vocational Education and Training Review**

The desire for vocational training to be flexible and responsive resulted in the rise of dodgy training providers that ripped off students through loan schemes and poor-quality teaching. TAFE was drained of funding and experienced industry expert lecturers left.

There is now a swing towards TAFE to re-establish the reputation of vocational training to its former glory.

The <u>All Eyes on Quality Review</u> grapples with the need for VET to continue to be flexible and responsive but to also deliver consistently high quality training.

#### This Review recommends:

- Enforcement of higher standards for organisations wanting to become a Registered Training Organisation.
- Focus on building strengths through industry engagement.
- Establish a National Tertiary Ombudsman as a one stop shop for complaints for students.
- Supporting Teachers to keep up with industry changes and...

• For a pinnacle teaching position called *Master Assessor* to be created.
