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Career News

Employment First

Students DO NOT have to be registered as unemployed to access these services.

Employment First Aid is a government funded pilot program that provides school to work transition support. That includes writing resumes,



interview skills, personal support and job search skills. It aims to help students to get a part time job, cope better when they have a job and apply for new jobs.

West Australian school students can contact <u>Employment First Aid</u> and get help to find a job. They can use the hotline or online at no cost.

Advice from Recruitment Consultants

Four industry recruitment consultants at the Career Advisors Networking conference in February gave the following advice about work in their industries:

- 1. **RESOURCES** Susan Morris, Recruitment and Operations Manager for <u>Brunel</u> <u>Resources Civil Engineering Recruitment</u>, has reported that:
- Engineering is a good specialization as it develops practical skills.
- There is so much demand for female engineers in the resources that they are trying to entice women who have left the industry to come back.
- When applying for jobs in civil engineering it is good to mention role models as it demonstrates industry awareness.
- 2. IT Haydn Bell, State Manager People Bank IT Recruiting
- People Bank has a database of experts that it calls on for urgent and contract jobs and it advertises in LinkedIn and Seek for longer term positions.
- They use <u>TechCheck</u> to test IT skills.
- CVs need to be 2 pages and show what responsibilities you have had and what you have achieved.
- Big demand for higher level IT skills like business analytics, IT systems developers and project managers. These require experience.
- Some students develop high level IT skills while still at school, TAFE graduates

- are great and uni degrees in IT are still good.
- IT work requires a commitment to keeping up with industry developments.
- Check the <u>Australian Computer Association</u> for scholarships and internship opportunities.

3. Business Services David Kempen, <u>Recruitment Senior Consultant PWC</u>

- Receives 2000 of applications from around Australia for 150 jobs in Perth.
- Commerce or business degree a good qualification.
- There is an online test first for jobs with PWC which has text boxes to fill in.
- Short listed applicants do a video interview that asks two questions one related to PWC and the other to explore the experience of the applicant. These results are short listed at an assessment centre
- Final stage is an interview with the manager.
- They are looking for risk takers, problem solvers and team players.
- Looking for gender balance in employees.
- 4. Health Industry Ian Newall Client Services Manager, Health Care Australia
- Significant job growth in jobs due to new Disability Services and aging population.
- Big demand for specialist nurses in jobs like intensive care, critical care and high dependency nursing. Nurses need to get experience and do post graduate education to get high demand jobs.
- There is a review of nursing education happening. One of the issues to be addressed will be the transition of nurses from training into jobs.
- Within 30 seconds of starting to read a resume you will be assessed as suitable or unsuitable.
- 2 page electronic resume with 8 10 bullet points about your last role.
- There are minimum standards, like a qualification, working with children clearance and police clearance. Check <u>HERE</u> for more information.

TISC Update from the CEO

Each year Wayne Betts, the head of TISC, speaks at the Notre Dame/Career Development Association workshop and he always makes regulations and stats interesting.


Key points that I took from his talk in February were:

- Students who don't meet the English language requirement for university entry can't be considered in first round offers.
- TISC has switched to electronic documents for information gathering and sharing. This has speeded up its processes and capacity to consult with universities.
- There is ongoing work trying to standardize information and processes across Australia so that students will have the same application processes in all states and territories.

• The new <u>Course Seeker</u> site provides information about courses at all Tertiary Admission Centre institutions. They are trying to make it possible to compare universities and similar courses at universities. This site will get better over time.



- There is growing emphasis on standardizing *special consideration* in application processes across universities across Australia.
- The focus on ATAR is reducing but uptake of alternative pathways has plateaued.
- TISC is producing a series of online videos which are gradually being added to the <u>TISC site</u>.
- The 2019 revised <u>TISC Guide</u> is out.
- Functionality of TISC Site has been improved as universities now provide predicted ATAR minimum so that it can be publicized. Students can plug their anticipated ATAR into the TISC site to see if they have a chance of being offered a place.





Year 11 students have the opportunity to undertake paid part-time employment-based training two days a week.



Future Ready National Education Strategy


Future Ready: A student-focused National Career Education Strategy was launched on Wednesday 13 February.






The National Agricultural Educations Association supports members by sharing good ideas, providing resources and

FYA Future Skills Framework 2013

The Foundation for Young Australians has released its <u>Future Skills Framework 2030</u>, outlining how Australian governments can work with young people, industry, educational institutions and leading thinkers across the country to move from talk to action.The Framework recommends:

1. A National Future Skills Symposium

To identify a pathway to ensuring young people get the skills they need.

2. A digital platform for future career insights

That provides young people with localised information on the jobs available and the skills they need.

3. Enterprise and work-integrated learning initiatives

That provide relevant and immersive enterprise education and meaningful paid work experience.

4. An ongoing Future Skills research program

Young people will need re-skilling due to automation
