She recently talked about <u>Five Fierce Forces</u> that are impacting on the western world. Applying these Forces to careers teaching helped me to understand how to guide millennials:

- <u>Save Our Society</u> millennials want to make a difference. They are turning becoming vegetarian, protesting about climate change and making ethical decisions about careers.
- <u>Anxiety Wave</u> This devastating 21st century anxiety epidemic is impacting decision making. The impulse to stay inside when the outside gets too tough and scary is evident in what they do and how they spend their money.
- Icon Toppling –There is a lack of trust in big, complex "adult" ideas. Their rejection of traditional pillars has given rise to criticism of the "me generation".
- 4. <u>EVEolution</u> feminine interest in relationships rather than in transactions is driving change across workplaces.
- <u>99 Lives</u> As news and ideas are delivered every second, millennials are becoming more anxious about missing out.

This month Deloitte released their controversial <u>Path to Prosperity: Why the Future is Human</u> research report which is the best report this year on the future of work.

The key points are:

Robots won't take your job

Where new technologies do take effect they generally create as many jobs as they kill. Individual tasks are more likely to be automated rather than entire jobs.

You probably won't spend your life changing jobs



Australians are staying in their jobs longer than ever. The gig economy isn't taking over. Casual jobs are a smaller share of all jobs than two decades ago although an increasing proportion of people is working part time, and many people have a side hustle like Airbnb or Uber driving.

The office is not going away

More of us are working flexibly but few work remotely. Working in physical proximity to other creative people who we collaborate and socialise with is becoming more important.

The nature of work is changing

Today's jobs are increasingly likely to require you to use your head rather than your hands and employment has been growing in the less routine jobs that are harder to automate. To keep up with these changes on the job training will become better and more frequent.

The future of work is female

To meet the needs of the future all employees will need to build skills and capabilities that have traditionally been more the domain of women and that demand the work of the heart – interpersonal, customer service, sales and creative roles.

University Course Costs

All universities charge about the same for their courses. You get into big differences according to the number of years you study.

Have a good look at the <u>UWA Fees Calculator</u>. It allows you to see courses by area of interest and by individual uni in 2019.

As a rough guide, each unit costs between \$800 and \$1400 and each year cost ABOUT \$9000.

If the course you choose requires you to do 24 units you will be up for roughly \$24,000.

Global IT company IBM has just rolled out its first neurodiversity program in Australia, at its Client Innovation Centre in Ballarat, putting 16 candidates with autism through their paces for four weeks and then hiring the 10 best

Curtin Mentors for Campus Life

ANOTHER report on Skilling the Australian workforce for the digital economy

The key messages of this research seem to be repeating what we have known for some time. Its recommendation that a multi-faceted approach to delivering 21st Century skills is needed, is hardly new.

Skilling the Australian workforce for the digital economy

The report provides a digital skills framework which would assist in the development of targeted training programs if the new federal government ever decides that that skilling Australia's workforce to thrive in the new economy would be a good thing.

We have yet to see any evidence of that as apprentice and trainee numbers continue to fall.

In the meantime, those companies that are aggressively adopting new technologies are pursuing a wide range of strategies including external recruitment and internal skills development and will keep up with the pack. All the rest are cautious and believe in "gradual cultural change"!!

This is despite being unhappy with the digital skills of VET qualifications and concern that future employees would not have enough digital skills.
