By December Western Australia's consumer confidence was the highest since 2007. We had the highest number of housing approvals on record.

Youth unemployment had fallen from 17% in the middle of 2020 to

13% and the number of hours that each person was able to work had gone up.

Opportunity for building apprentices had soared to 2004 levels and there have been significant opportunities for work through the National Disability Scheme. Training had come in to support skills development in these industries and there are such significant subsidies that some apprentices were paying their way without doing any work!!

FROM GLOBALIZATION TO SOVEREIGN CAPACITY

A significant move is underway to manufacture what we need in Australia. This is partly due to:

- automation has reduced the need to go offshore for cheap labour.
- the need to ensure continuity of supply; and
- the need for quality control of end products.

WAYNE BETTS, EXECUTIVE OFFICER, TISC

Wayne was open and honest again, doing what he could to make sure we had as much

information as possible for 2022 enrolments.

- TISC had a 34% drop in applications at the end of 2020 due to the early offers that had been made by some unis.
- Some students had already accepted 2 3 offers and still applied for more places through TISC. Wayne said we will have more idea of actual enrolments by the end of March.
- Indicative ATAR scores were messed up for 2022 due to the range of application processes. This year it will therefore be difficult to give Year 12s an indicative score for 2022 course entry requirements.



FEEDBACK TO TISC

TISC has received feedback on the 2021 application process from over 200 schools. This information has been forwarded to universities.

The relaxation of pressure seemed to be good for some students, but others relaxed too much once they had accepted an offer. There were reports of students dropping out of school and walking out of exams which has led to a general concern about students' preparedness for university.

Wayne expressed concern that the use of Year 11 results by some universities may push pressure down to Year 11s.

TISC GUIDE

This Guide is for students who started uni in 2021. It provides standard information but thigs may have changed this year. Wayne said that the 2022 Guide will be produced once unis finalize what they will offer in 2022.

TISC is doing its best to be a steadying influence through all of this.

The University of Notre Dame Australia has become a Table A university under the Higher Education Support Act.

This means:



- Eligible students will have full access to Commonwealth
 Supported Places (CSP) and HECS-HELP for all undergraduate degrees at Notre
 Dame.
- Domestic undergraduate students will now pay the same fees at Notre Dame as if they were attending a public university.

<u>This analysis in The Conversation</u> identifies the good and bad aspects of the proposed industrial relations laws. School leavers and less powerful workers are most likely to be badly impacted as:

The bill also proposes to "simplify" the agreement-making process and make it harder for unions and others not directly involved to object to their approval.

This would weaken the few procedural safeguards that the Fair Work Act provides for

workers, especially since there is no requirement for bargaining or negotiation to take place.
