NAPLAN

NAPLAN testing will run from Tuesday 9 May 2017 to Friday 12 May 2017 (Week 3) for our Year 7 and 9 students. It is very important that students attend the NAPLAN tests, as attaining a 'Band 8' result will exclude them from sitting future OLNA testing. High achievement in these tests also place students in good stead for studying an ATAR pathway.

NAPLAN Test Conditions: The following items are NOT permitted in the NAPLAN test area under any circumstances -

- ♦ Mobile phones
- Smart watch or other internet-or Bluetooth-enabled device
- ♦ rulers

Shamus Whately from Avon Youth Community and Family Service is organising one workshop/focus group in **Merredin** on Sunday 21 May from 10am to 3pm as part of a funded project to ask young people (16-22 years of age) such questions as:

EXTERNALLY SET TASKS (ESTS)

All students enrolled in a General Year 12 course and/or a Foundation Year 12 course are required to complete the externally set task (EST) developed by the Authority for that course. The EST is compulsory and forms part of the school-based assessment and is included as a separate assessment type with a weighting of 15% for the pair of units.

The ESTs are administered in schools during Term 2 under standard test conditions. This will be Week 5 at Merredin College.
