MISSING SCHOOL DOES MATTER

1.90% Attendance rate - If your child misses 1 day per fortnight that equals 1 month per year and adds up to missing nearly 1 1/2 years of school. In Year 12, they have only received the education of someone half way through Year 11.

- **2. 80% Attendance rate** If your child misses 1 day per week that equals 2 months per year and adds up to missing nearly 2 1/2 years of school. In Year 12, they have only received the education of someone half way through Year 10.
- **3. 60% Attendance rate** If your child misses 2 days per week that equals 4 months of the year and adds up to missing nearly 5 years of school. In Year 12, they have only received the education of someone in Year 7.
- **4. 40% Attendance rate** If your child misses 3 days per week that equals 6 months per year and adds up to nearly 8 years of school. In Year 12, they have only received the education of someone in Year 4.

HEADLICE

From the Nurses desk welcome back to Term 1. I hope you all feel rested.

Just a reminder about the need to check children's hair for nits regularly. The information below may help! Please don't hesitate to contact me for more information or some strategies to stop the cycle.

Head lice are tiny insects that live in human hair. They are not caused by poor hygiene and they do not carry diseases. Head lice transfer from child to child when their hair is in close contact, e.g. while playing or doing schoolwork. For this reason, head lice infestation is relatively common in school children. I seek the support of all parents in assisting to break the seemingly never-ending cycle of head lice infestation. Please commit to:

- Regular screening of your child/ren for head lice (at least weekly);
- If head lice are detected, commence treatment immediately;
- Please keep your child/ren at home until such time as you have commenced treatment for the head lice and the lice removed (can be returned to school once treatment has started)

MERREDIN COLLEGE Attendance at 2018 School Ball

The criteria required for attendance at the Ball were established to encourage students to make the right choices. Currently there are four main ways by which students can lose Good Standing:

- Behaviour (Suspensions)
- Work completion
- Attendance
- Mobile Phone use and Uniform

Behaviour (Suspensions): If students lose their Good Standing for Behaviour (in or out of school suspensions) at any stage from Semester 2 2017 then they lose their right to attend the Ball (without exception).

Work Completion: If students lose their Good Standing due to not completing work to a satisfactory standard in Semester 2 2017, they can restore Good Standing by submitting all assigned tasks before the end of the year. As a result they are able to attend an appeal meeting with a Deputy Principal to plead their case.

If students don't complete all their work in Semester 1 2018, then they are ineligible to attend the Ball.

Good Standing for work completion is not automatically restored after a set time period but rather only once the set tasks have been submitted. (Even if the relevant teacher decides to award a 0% score for the task).

Class Preparedness: Student who are unprepared for class on 5 occasions will lose Good Standing. This includes students who fail to purchase and bring the required text books for Year 11 and 12.

Attendance: The attendance average from Semester 2 2017 until the time of the Ball needs to be at least 90%. Attendance that is less than 90% needs to be explained in a review meeting with a Deputy Principal.

Mobile Phone/Uniform: If students lose their Good Standing for uniform or mobile phone use in Semester 2 2017 then they will need to attend an appeal meeting with a Deputy Principal to plead their case in order to be considered to attend the Ball. Attendance at the Ball is still at the Deputy Principal's discretion.

Students who lose Good Standing in 2018 for any reason are unable to earn back their right to attend without exception.
