WA DAY PUBLIC HOLIDAY—MONDAY 5 JUNE 2017 AND SCHOOL DEVELOPMENT DAY—TUESDAY 6 JUNE 2017

Next Monday 5 June is WA Day. The following day, Tuesday 6 June is a student-free day as staff will be engaged in a School Development Day. This day promises to be an interesting one which should address the needs of most of our teachers and education assistants. We have teachers and education assistants attending from all of the schools in the Eastern Wheatbelt Education Network.

We wish all staff, students and their families an enjoyable long weekend and remind everyone that all students should be back at school on Wednesday 7 June.

WORKPLACE VIOLENCE

At Merredin College we expect the highest standard of behaviour from our students towards staff and one another. Equally, we expect that our interactions with parents, carers and the wider community will be respectful. Violent, threatening behaviour will not be tolerated and nor should it be.

Fortunately the majority of our students are outstanding young people and conduct themselves well. This article therefore applies to a minority of students.

Every member of our staff has the right to work in a safe environment that is free from aggressive behaviour, threats and violence. To this end, violence of any type is not tolerated at Merredin College. Workplace violence can be defined as 'any action or incident that physically or psychologically harms another person. It includes situations where staff and other people are threatened, attacked and/or physically assaulted at work. It may include damage to property and may occur on or off school site.'

An increasing number of secondary students seem to think that non-compliance with a reasonable instruction from a staff member is okay. Some respond with abuse or threats when asked to comply with a school rule which can be as simple as being asked to sit in a specific seat in the class or to put their phone away. This is simply not acceptable. At the extreme end, when threats or intimidation are used, this constitutes violence and has a negative impact on the mental well-being of staff. In some cases, when parents are contacted, they support their child or blame the school. For ongoing offenders, I find this lack of support hard to accept. Regardless of what sort of day a student has had, there is no excuse for this type of conduct and it is in the best interests of parents and carers to work with the school to change this behaviour.

To curb this aggressive behaviour, Merredin College will be reviewing Individual Behaviour Management Plans. Parents/carers will be requested to attend to provide an opportunity for input. Whether or not this offer is taken up, the plan will be implemented.

Due to the effect on the safety and health of employees and others at the workplace, violence and aggression are unlawful under the Occupational Safety

and Health Act 1984 (the Act). Under the law, school staff have the same rights as any other public officer. When workplace violence or aggression involves physical assault or threat of assault the incident becomes a police matter and is dealt with under the criminal code.

I am sure all agree that we need to look after our fantastic staff who hold the keys to our future, education.
