CHANGE OF BUS DROP-OFF AND PICK UP AREA AND USE OF FARM BY STUDENTS

PROTECTIVE BEHAVIOURS-KEEPING YOUR CHILD SAFE FROM ABUSE

Merredin College staff teach students a range of skills and strategies to help prevent and reduce child abuse and violence in the community. Our programs seek to prevent child abuse by providing greater awareness and understanding and the ability for children to tell someone if they feel unsafe. In addition to the curriculum presented by teachers, we enlist the support of *Protective Behaviours WA* to present workshops to students, staff and parents. There website found at https://www.protectivebehaviourswa.org.au/ contains a wealth of information which I strongly advise parents to visit. A strong message we need to ensure parents/carers give to their children is that 'they (the child) can talk with someone about anything, no matter what it is. Unsafe secrets should be shared.'

Students who feel unsafe can talk to any staff member and in particular their teacher, an education assistant, College Chaplain, Year Coordinator, Nurse, or Deputy/Principal. This information is displayed in Student Services and in other parts of the school.

POSITIVE BEHAVIOUR SUPPORT (PBS)

The Working Smarter Matrix

A group of staff along with Lisa Fischer (College Board) meet fortnightly in our quest to support the implementation of positive behaviour across the whole school. This is a lengthy process and will take a couple of years to be fully implemented. At Wednesday's meeting we refined our 'Working Smarter Matrix' where we have reviewed all of the programs which we currently have in place to support students with behaviour and engagement, wellbeing, curriculum and assessment and social skills. We have also included community engagement initiatives because we believe that parents should be partners in their child's education. Our job is to evaluate the effectiveness of each of these programs so that our support programs all align with the PBS philosophy.

Through consultation with parents, students and staff we have identified the four behavioural expectations which if successfully embedded will create our 'perfect' school environment. We believe that as a school community we will GROW our ideal environment through being CARING, RESPECTFUL, RESPONSIBLE and STRIVING TO SUCCEED. We have identified the types of behaviours which will show all of these values at work in every area of school life so that students and staff will have a common understanding. For example - We show we care in the classroom by speaking kindly. Obviously there are several other examples which show care in the classroom. These behaviours are recorded in a Merredin College Behaviour Matrix and will be presented for student feedback. We have developed separate primary and secondary matrices simply because the language needs to suit the age of the child.
