NAPLAN EXEMPTIONS AND WITHDRAWALS

Year 3, 5, 7 and 9 students will be undertaking NAPLAN Online in Term 2 between the 15 and 25 May. Information for parents of Year 3, 5, 7 and 9 students will be sent home as a hard copy in Week 8 and also as an electronic copy attached to next week's Link

Students in Year 5 and 7 will be undertaking a 'practice run' on Thursday 5 April. Other practice opportunities will occur for all Year 3, 5, 7 and 9 students before Week 3, Term 2 when the actual tests occur.

Exemptions may apply as follows:

- Students with a significant intellectual disability and/or condition that limits their capacity to participate
- Students who have been attending a school in Australia for less than one year before the tests

Parents or carers may withdraw their child from the tests to address issues such as religious beliefs and philosophical objections to testing.

All requests for exemption from testing or withdrawal from testing must be received by the school by Friday 6 April. Exemption and Withdrawal Forms can be collected from primary administration or the main office.

MOBILE PHONE USE

Since the introduction of the *Bring Your Own Device Policy*, the implementation of the *Mobile Phone Policy* has the been relaxed in order to assess the impact on student learning and behaviour. Staff wish to re-impose the restrictions regarding mobile phone use because:

- The distractions caused by mobile phones outweighs any educational benefits. Many students spend valuable learning time texting and/or listening to music.
- Some students have been known to text one another in class and then create an excuse to leave class to meet up with friends. This often leads to poor behavioural choices.

Staff will be meeting to finalise the policy and then it will be discussed with students. After this, a 'No Tolerance' approach will be adopted in the interests of providing the best educational environment possible for our students.

VISIT BY BLACK DOG INSTITUTE

Next Tuesday 20 March, Years 8, 9 and 10 student will be taking part in a seminar called 'Insights' presented by the Black Dog Institute. Insights is a free 30-minute presentation which educates students on signs and symptoms of mental illness, how to seek help, and how to support friends. Our Insights presenters share their own lived experience of mental illness to help reduce the stigma associated with mental illness. WACE CHECKER DEVELOPED TO ASSIST YEAR 12 STUDENTS MONITOR THEIR PROGRESS TOWARDS ACHIEVING THE WACE

Students are reminded that the School Curriculum and Standards Authority (the Authority) has developed a WACE Checker for Year 12 students. The WACE Checker is a tool which Year 12s can use to check their progress towards achieving their Western Australian Certificate of Education (WACE) and is now available on the Authority website at: https://wacechecker.scsa.wa.edu.au/.

The WACE Checker is provided as a guide only. The report it provides students must not be interpreted as a guarantee that the student will achieve a WACE. Achievement of the WACE is dependent on the calculation of a student's final results and completion of courses. Individuals are encouraged to consult the WACE Manual for the relevant year, or their school, should they wish to confirm WACE eligibility for a student based on enrolment and predicted/actual achievement.

To use the WACE Checker, students will need to add information about their achievements in Year 11 and their expected achievements in Year 12. The checker will be of most assistance if the information provided for Year 12 is realistic. When students add their anticipated grades for Year 12, they need to add what they realistically expect to achieve this year.

The WACE Checker will be particularly useful for students considering changes to their education program which may affect their eligibility for the WACE.

The WACE Checker allows students to save the summary of their input as a Portable Document Format (PDF). They can use this PDF to track their progress and to check the impact of any changes to their enrolment or achievement.

Students can also use a save function which will keep the data entered into the checker for a month. An access code is provided to allow students to use the 'Fetch My Data' button when they select that option in the checker.

MERREDIN COLLEGE Attendance at 2018 School Ball

The criteria required for attendance at the Ball were established to encourage students to make the right choices. Currently there are four main ways by which students can lose Good Standing:

- Behaviour (Suspensions)
- Work completion
- Attendance
- Mobile Phone use and Uniform

Behaviour (Suspensions): If students lose their Good Standing for Behaviour (in or out of school suspensions) at any stage from Semester 2 2017 then they lose their right to attend the Ball (without exception).

Work Completion: If students lose their Good Standing due to not completing work to a satisfactory standard in Semester 2 2017, they can restore Good Standing by submitting all assigned tasks before the end of the year. As a result they are able to attend an appeal meeting with a Deputy Principal to plead their case.

If students don't complete all their work in Semester 1 2018, then they are ineligible to attend the Ball.

Good Standing for work completion is not automatically restored after a set time period but rather only once the set tasks have been submitted. (Even if the relevant teacher decides to award a 0% score for the task).

Class Preparedness: Students who are unprepared for class on 5 occasions will lose Good Standing. This includes students who fail to purchase and bring the required text books for Year 11 and 12.

Attendance: The attendance average from Semester 2 2017 until the time of the Ball needs to be at least 90%. Attendance that is less than 90% needs to be explained in a review meeting with a Deputy Principal.

Mobile Phone/Uniform: If students lose their Good Standing for not wearing the correct uniform or mobile phone use in Semester 2 2017 then they will need to attend an appeal meeting with a Deputy Principal to plead their case in order to be considered to attend the Ball. Attendance at the Ball is still at the Deputy Principal's discretion.

Students who lose Good Standing in 2018 for any reason are unable to earn back their right to attend without exception.
