We have enjoyed a smooth start to the school year with student attendance generally good. Currently 75% of our students are regular attenders as they are absent for no more than half a day per week. Ideally all students should be regular attenders. Parents/carers need to support our staff to ensure their children attend every day. We cannot teach your child unless they are here and YES they do fall behind when they are absent!

Census day (17 February) arrived and we had 270 primary students and 345 secondary students enrolled (Total = 615). Last year, there were 250 primary and 353 secondary students (Total = 603). Increased primary numbers have meant a new Preprimary class has been set up. We welcome Emily McKercher as the new class teacher.

2016 Year 12 Results

Staff are delighted with our attainment rate. 98% of our Year 12 students carved out a successful post-school pathway because they either gained entry into a University (an ATAR score of 55 or better) and/or a Certificate 11. Attainment leads students into university, work opportunities or TAFE. 85% of our students graduated which means they achieved

Western Australian Certificate of Secondary Education. This was the first year of the more rigorous WACE requirements We are especially delighted by the results of our ATAR students. Three students gained an ATAR of more than 80 giving them direct entry to UWA. This was a mighty achievement and shows just what can be done if you put your mind to it!



Trent Starcevich gained an ATAR score of 97.6 and so was placed in the top 6.5 % of ATAR students – a mighty achievement!

HOME ECONOMICS

Year 7 students have been introduced to sewing equipment and have been learning how to thread a sewing machine. They have been learning how to follow a basic recipe and successfully completed a batch of corn fritters for their first cooking practical of the year.

Year 8 students have been revising cooking rules and procedures. They completed their first recipe with Miss Robins, blue pancakes, yum. Year 8 students have also been revising sewing basics which they will be using to construct a patchwork cushion.


We also welcome Teagan Pascoe as our School Psychologist and welcome back Brett Guthrie as our School Chaplain.

YEAR 10 PHYSICAL EDUCATION PROGRAM

Physical Education has a new look for Year 10 students in 2017. This year the Year 10 students have been given the option to choose from 3 different sporting electives this year: 1) Ball Sports, 2) Fitness and 3) Physical Recreation. The fitness class focuses on building stronger bodies and encouraging students to maintain body strength through basic exercises. We have started to build a fitness centre on the mezzanine floor in the gym for the fitness class. This new fitness centre will be beneficial for not only our Year 10 students, but those in our Certificate II Sports Coaching and Physical Education Studies for both ATAR and General classes. The Physical Recreation class focuses on more of the social side of sport whilst still creating a competitive learning environment. Students in this class have been playing darts from the beginning of this term and will be moving on to other sports such as bocce,

orienteering, table tennis and lawn bowls. The Ball Sports class focuses on the traditional model of Physical Education playing team sports such as tennis, volleyball, netball and water polo. Already we are seeing greater participation rates and performance from the Year 10s. Another addition to the Physical Education Program is a Specialist Volleyball sporting option. We have identified that volleyball is a sport that students in all years enjoy and have developed a program that will further develop students interest and skill. This volleyball program will help those students choosing Physical Education Studies ATAR and General courses as well as developing skills for the Country Week competition.


