






Message from the Principal......

TRIPLE P—THE POWER OF POSITIVE PARENTING

In Term 2 Merredin College held Triple P seminars for parents. These seminars offered tips and ideas to help raise happy and confident kids; see more of the behaviours you like and less of the ones you don't; and have better relationships with your family. Each week we will be sharing with you a tip from one of the aspects of the Triple P Program.

Using assertive discipline

Assertive discipline involves being consistent, acting quickly when children misbehave, and teaching them to behave in an acceptable way. It involves staying calm and using fair, predictable consequences that match the problem behaviour.

When children are misbehaving or upset, it is best to remain calm and avoid yelling, name calling, threatening or spanking.

You can value your child's individuality and still expect reasonable behaviour. Discipline helps children to accept necessary rules and limits and to develop self-control. Through discipline, children learn to consider others and to express their feelings in ways that respect the needs of others. Discipline also helps children to accept responsibility for their actions.

Discipline works best when children live in a predictable world and receive plenty of attention for good behaviour. It also works best when parents support each other and use the same approach.

Here are some tips for assertive discipline:

Set some ground rules

Discuss two or three simples rules you would like your child to follow in a particular situation. Rules should tell your child what to do rather than what not to do. For example, good shopper rules might include staying close, using a pleasant voice, and keeping your hands to yourself.

Praise good behaviour

When your child behaves well and follows the rules, congratulate and praise them, this is especially important when your child is learning something new.

Watch and supervise

Make sure you can see what your child is doing. This way, if a problem arises you can deal with it straight away.

STUDENT SIGN OUT PROCEDURES

Please be advised of the following process to ensure a quick and efficient student sign out process when collecting your child during the school day.

- 1. Arrange a time for your child to meet you at Student Services.
- 2. Send a note with your child so they can show their classroom teacher the time they are required to leave the class to go to Student Services to sign out.
- 3. When signing out students will then leave their permission note at Student Services and receive a 'Leave Pass'.
- 4. Students are required to then sign back in at Student Services and collect a 'Late Note' to go back to their class.

Unfortunately it is not always appropriate to use the PA to call children to Student Services. We like to minimise the use of the PA as it does interrupt every classroom in the school. It is also preferable to not use the PA at all during examinations and other special events happening in school.

MECKERING CROSS COUNTRY

A group of 19 students from Years 4 to 10 will be representing the College at this year's Meckering Cross Country Championships on Friday 17 August 2017. These students were chosen through their excellent results at our House Cross Country Carnival late in Term 2. Students involved have been given permission forms to attend and are due to be returned to Student Services by 16 August 2018.

YEAR 10 ENGLISH EXCURSION—PERTH

On 18 August Mr. Baltovich's Year 10.1 English class will attend the historic His Majesty's Theatre in Perth to view the screenplay adaptation of Mark Haddon's famous novel 'The Curious Incident of the Dog in the Night-time'. Students have been reading and studying the novel in class, which tells the adventure of an autistic 15 year old boy named Christopher Boone, as he uncovers the mystery of who killed the next door neighbour's dog, whilst stumbling upon some much more dramatic secrets. UNIFORMS

A reminder to parents that should students present to school more than 5 times with incorrect uniform or inappropriate clothing they will lose their Good Standing. Stepping Stones Triple P Positive Parenting Seminars -For Parents of Children with A Disability

If your child has a particular behaviour or developmental problem that is making family life more difficult than it should be, then Stepping Stones Triple P (SSTP) can help

Stepping Stones Triple P is part of the Triple P parenting program, and has been specially tailored for parents of children with a disability. It doesn't tell you how to be a parent. It's more like a toolbox of ideas. You choose the strategies you need. You choose the way you want to use them. It's all about making it work for you.

This free Stepping Stones Triple P Seminar is open to all parents and will help you:

- Raise happy, confident kids
- Manage misbehaviour so everyone in the family enjoys life more
- Set rules and routines that everyone respects and follows
- Encourage behaviour you like
- Take care of yourself as a parent
- Feel confident you're doing the right thing
- Take part in community events
- Develop plans for tricky situations

Positive parenting is based on strong, nurturing relationships, good communication and positive attention.

Seminar 1: Positive Parenting for Parents of Children with a Disability

This seminar introduces parents to the seven key steps to positive parenting for parents of children with a disability;

- Create a safe, interesting environment
- Have a positive learning environment
- Use assertive discipline
- Adapt to having a child with a disability
- Have realistic expectations
- 6. Be part of the community
- Take care of yourself as a parent The Seminar includes a 90 minute presentation with time for open discussion and question time.

Parents who have attended these seminars previously report that they feel more confident, less angry and less stressed. It also helped to promote their child's development. Now that's positive!

Healthy Country Kids Ears Health





Eastern Wheatbelt Primary Health Service is excited to announce our new Healthy Country Kids Ears Clinic! This clinic is open to all children living in the Eastern Wheatbelt

Otitis media (middle ear infections) can begin within weeks of birth and can recur into adolescence and adulthood. If left untreated middle ear infections can lead to hearing loss, developmental and learning delays. This program will work in screening, treatment, self-management and prevention of future infections and complications

This is a FREE service that will use telehealth to link you with Ear Nose and Throat specialists at Perth Children's Hospital, allowing for a specialist appointment for your child without needing to travel to Perth.

To make an appointment please ask for a referral from your GP.
