### STUDENT SAFETY GOING TO AND FROM SCHOOL

It is important to regularly discuss with your child/ren the need to take care when going to and from school, and to report anything suspicious to you, the school and the police.

Here are some suggestions to help your children stay safe:

- · always travel in a group
- · walk on the right hand side of the road to face oncoming traffic
- · wherever possible, leave space between you and the roadway
- stay in areas that are well lit
- stay in view avoid going into areas that are hidden (such as parkland bush or behind shopping centres)
- be alert earphones and headphones can reduce your awareness considerably
- · if you have a mobile phone, have it turned on and ready to dial an emergency number
- · if a passing car stops nearby, never get too close
- · run from a situation if you feel at risk
- · give this advice to your brothers and sisters, especially if they are younger
- · if you can get it safely, try to photograph or remember the number plate of the car
- · report numbers plates of cars and the clothing or distinguishing features of individuals to police.

#### **RURAL AND REGIONAL SCHOLARSHIPS**

The Rural and Regional Enterprise Scholarships Program supports students with the costs of studying at university or at a vocational education and training institution. The scholarships are valued at up to \$18,000 each and are available to support students studying for six months full-time or up to 8 years part-time, on campus, or through online and distance education.

The course must be either Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM), Health or Agriculture with a qualification level of: Certificate IV; Diploma; Advanced Diploma or Associate Degree; Bachelor Degree; Bachelor Honours Degree, Graduate Certificate or Graduate Diploma; Master Degree or a Doctoral Degree.

"Apart from my job as MCS at Carcoola Primary, I am also the Battalion Commander for 52 Battalion which 510 Army Cadet Unit, Merredin belongs to. Currently Captain(AAC) Robert Endersbee is running the Unit but is hoping to retire after Christmas which means we haven't got anyone to step up to take over. We have approached the RSL but most members are in their retirement and are not interested in assisting.

I am contacting you to see if anyone would be interested. Army Cadets belong to the Defence Force Cadets and is the biggest Youth Organisation in Australia with a military feel and we come under the Australian Army umbrella. Staff are fully trained and our training courses are held in the Eastern States and it is a 10 day duration for the Basic Course. Cadets run each week during the term and as part of the Battalion, it is my responsibility to organise 2 camps a year and a Weapons training weekend for the year. We have an annual camp in the first week of the October school holidays, held at Bindoon Military Training camp.

Army Cadets are huge in the Eastern States with some schools such as Kings College having over 800 Cadets. One Battalion in Victoria is purely school based units with teachers running their respective units.

Unless we find somebody to come into the Unit, the Unit unfortunately may be shut which would be such a shame. Rob is happy to mentor anybody that would like to become an Officer of Cadets and we also have a former Officer Commander living in the community whom I am sure would also assist.
