REGIONAL EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

ONLINE LITERACY AND NUMERACY (OLNA)

The school has purchased a subscription to OLNA Support. This will provide our students with practice OLNA type questions to best familiarise them with the OLNA test. The OLNA Writing will occur on Tuesday 5 March, Reading Monday 11 March and Numeracy 18 March. The use of this site by Year 10, 11 & 12 students who have not yet qualified for OLNA is highly encouraged. Students will also be able to access the OLNA Support program from home. Students who did not attain Band 8 in Year 9 NAPLAN must successfully complete OLNA Reading, Writing and Numeracy during Year 10, 11 or 12 to qualify for the Western Australian Certificate of Education.

ATTENDANCE

To ensure that students are able to 'strive for success' it is very important that they attend school regularly. We have made an excellent start so far this year with an attendance of 93.5%, with every year group exceeding 90%. If your child is unable to attend school please let us know. To remain in 'Good Standing' students must have an attendance of more than 90% to be able to participate in various extra curricula activities throughout the year.

NAPLAN AND STUDENT READINESS FOR NAPLAN ONLINE

Students at Merredin College and across the country will be sitting NAPLAN online on 14-24 May. In preparation, ACARA's NAPLAN Online public demonstration site is available for public access. This resource will enable students and parents to interact with minitests in Reading, Writing, Conventions of Language and Numeracy for each of Years 3, 5, 7 and 9. The items in these tests have been chosen to demonstrate the type of items which students will encounter in the NAPLAN Online tests. HEAD LICE

Head lice are small biting insects that live and breed on your head. They reproduce by laying eggs on the hair shaft, the part of your hair closest to the scalp. Head lice are spread between people when head-to-head contact, such as hugging and playing, is made with someone who does have head lice.

Head lice can cause an itchy feeling on your head, although this itchiness may take weeks to develop and some may not experience this symptom at all. In most cases, you will need to look at the hair to see if lice are present.

Checking for head lice

Head lice can move very quickly and be hard to spot in dry hair.

To check for head lice:

- Know what you are looking for. Adult lice are usually dark brown and about 3 mm long, young lice are a lighter brown colour • and smaller, and eggs will be attached to the hair shaft.
- Comb plenty of conditioner (any brand) through dry hair and comb hair in sections using a very fine-tooth 'nit comb'.
- Wipe the waste from the comb on a white paper towel regularly and inspect for lice and eggs in strong light e.g. sunlight.

If head lice are found, check the rest of the family at home for lice and inform your school. Start a treatment method and once completed, continue to check hair weekly for further outbreaks.

Head lice can be easily spread between children at school, so remind your child to avoid head-to-head contact. To prevent outbreaks, check hair regularly for head lice and eggs, tie long hair back and avoid sharing combs and brushes.

CONNECT—FINDING OUT WHAT YOUR YEAR 10-12 CHILD IS STUDYING, WHAT ASSESSMENTS ARE DUE AND HOW THEY ARE PROGRESSING

Connect is an integrated online environment developed by the Department of Education WA for staff, students and parents in public schools. Check out the short video clip on Connect at https://wimeo.com/connectwa/welcome

Each parent is given their own secure login to Connect. Connect is totally free and, because it is provided by the Department of Education, very safe. As well as being able to login to Connect on any internet-enabled device, you may also receive notices from Connect that will be sent to you as either an email or a notification on your phone. A free app called *Connect Now* can be downloaded from Google Play or the Apple App Store and will let you receive Connect notices as push notifications. If you have multiple children you only need one login – even if your children attend different public schools.

When you login to Connect you will be able to see information specific to your own child/ren such as:

- •The classes in which your children are engaged
- •Class calendars
- •Assessment Outlines information drawn from Reporting to Parents (secondary)
- •Assessments and evidence for your own child
- •Notices from your child's classes that automatically generate an email or phone notification to you.

To register for Connect please read and sign the attached *Connect Conditions of Use for Parents* and complete the *Parents Registration Form* and return to the school as soon as possible or scan and email the signed documents to Sandra.Lee@education.wa.edu.au. You will then be confidentially issued with your unique user name and password for Connect.

We see Connect as an exciting new way for you to stay in touch with your child's school journey.

ON ENTRY ASSESSMENT FOR PRE-PRIMARY STUDENTS

During Week 4 of Term 1 all children in Preprimary will be participating in the Department of Education's state-wide On-entry Assessment Program.

The purpose of the program is to provide teachers with an opportunity, early in the year, to collect information on the essential literacy and numeracy skills and understandings of each child in their class. This will assist your child's teacher to develop informed and intentional play-based teaching programs, designed to reflect individual needs and foster each child's learning.

Some assessment tasks can be included in the daily teaching program and some will be carried out one-to-one, in a quiet area. This will provide your child and their teacher with valuable time together, as well as give the teacher the opportunity to observe the behaviours and processes your child uses in responding to questions.

SCHOOL BANKING

School Banking is on Wednesday mornings in the wet area of the Early Childhood Block (Block 1). School Banking is available between 8.30am-8.50am. Forms can be collected at this time if you would like to set up an account for your child. School Banking encourages kids to save a little money each week (any amount) into their Youthsaver account, helping them learn about the value of money and develop a good saving habit. The Youthsaver account is a savings account with no monthly fees and a competitive bonus interest rate when at least one deposit (excluding interest and bank initiated transactions) and no withdrawals are made each calendar month. Each time a child makes a School Banking deposit they earn a silver Dollarmites token. Once they've collected 10 tokens, they can redeem them for an exciting reward.

MERREDIN COLLEGE Attendance at 2019 School Ball

The general restrictions on attendance at the Ball were established to encourage students to make the right choices. Currently there are four main ways by which students can lose Good Standing:

- Behaviour (Suspensions)
- Work completion
- Attendance
- Mobile Phone use and Uniform

Behaviour (Suspensions): If students lose their Good Standing for Behaviour (In or out of school Suspensions) at any stage from Semester 2 2018 then they lose their right to attend the Ball (without exception).

Work Completion: If students lose their Good Standing due to not completing work to a satisfactory standard in Semester 2 2018, they can restore Good Standing by submitting all assigned tasks before the end of the year. As a result they are able to attend an appeal meeting with a Deputy Principal to plead their case.

If students don't complete all their work in Semester 1 2019, then they are ineligible to attend the Ball.

Good Standing for work completion is not automatically restored after a set time period but rather only once the set tasks have been submitted. (Even if the relevant teacher decides to award a 0% score for the task).

Class Preparedness: Student that are unprepared for class on 5 occasions or warnings will lose good standing.

Attendance: The attendance average from Semester 2 2018 until the time of the Ball needs to be at least 90%. Attendance that is less than 90% needs to be explained in a review meeting with a Deputy Principal.

Mobile Phone/Uniform: If students lose their Good Standing for uniform or mobile phone use in Semester 2 2018 then they will need to attend an appeal meeting with a Deputy Principal to plead their case in order to be considered to attend the Ball. Attendance at the Ball is still at the Deputy Principal's discretion.

Students who lose Good Standing in 2019 are unable to earn back their right to attend without exception.
