## Message from the Principal......

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Welcome back to Term 2 and a very warm welcome to our new Mathematics teacher Mr Matthew Thomas. It has been a very smooth beginning to this term and in general our students have made an impressive start to their learning.

#### **ASBESTOS**

I am writing to inform you of the situation at Merredin College and to address the issues raised in a recent media article regarding the presence of asbestos at this site.

Fragments of asbestos containing materials have been found across some areas of the site, and were brought to the attention of the Department of Education in 2017.

Following the initial report, the Department engaged an environmental consultant to assess the extent of the contamination and to provide advice to enable the Department and the college to manage the situation.

The consultant determined that the level of contamination is in most instances below the Department of Health guidelines for the management and control of asbestos in soils.

Asbestos in soil poses a negligible health risk when left undisturbed, however as a precaution, the affected areas have comprehensively picked over and any asbestos containing materials removed. The unused parts of the site have also been fenced off and warning signs posted to restrict access to these areas.

The Department has advised that soil intrusive activities must not be undertaken without reference to the Department of Finance Building Management and Works, who will ensure correct procedures are followed should any soil intrusive activity be required.

The consultant's report has been submitted to the Department of Water and Environmental Regulation and the Department is working with this agency to manage the situation.

Further investigation is underway and we will provide an update as more information comes to hand. In the interim, if you have any questions, please contact me at school on 90410900

#### ANZAC DAY

On Friday 12 April, Merredin College held two ANZAC Day assemblies. These ceremonies were held to recognise and commemorate the gallant efforts of all Australian men and women who have served in the defence forces and to remember their courage, their compassion and the sacrifices they made.

Our students actively participated in this very important occasion with readings and facts, presented with a real sense of the occasion and with a rich understanding of the significance of ANZAC Day.

Both the primary and secondary ceremonies were very moving and a fitting way of honouring our service men and women.

#### ATTENDANCE

Although our attendance rates are generally very good at Merredin (currently 92%+ in all year groups except year 9, 10 and 12 where it is 87.8%, 86.1% and 88.5% respectively). Congratulations to the 450 students who have attended more than 90%, in particular the 141 students who attended every day in Term 1. I remind parents and carers that the attendance of your child at school is one of the biggest contributing factors to successful achievement. As a rough guide, it is considered that a minimum of 90% attendance is essential for academic success.

Our staff in general and our Student Services Team in particular, monitor the attendance of your child on a daily basis and will report to you if there is any cause for concern. The message for all students though is 'every class every day'. We really need parents to stand firm when their child asks to stay home - particularly if they are NOT especially unwell. We also ask parents to understand that taking their child on an extended holiday throughout the school term is not OK either and risks considerable academic hardship (please use the school holidays, not the school term, for holidays – that is what they are there for).

We really appreciate it when parents advise us in advance or at the time that a child is going to be away. Remember that this serves to reinforce the strong partnership that exists at Merredin between school and home.

#### **SCHOOL UNIFORM**

Well the cold weather has certainly arrived this week and we would like to remind parents and carers that students should wear the appropriate school uniform. There are various uniform options available from our uniform shop.

This resource will enable students and parents to interact with minitests in Reading, Writing, Conventions of Language and Numeracy for each of Years 3, 5, 7 and 9. The items in these tests have been chosen to demonstrate the type of items which students will encounter in the NAPLAN Online tests. 
