YEAR 11 AND 12 STUDENTS ON SCHOOL SITE

Now that the Year 11 and 12 students have finished school for the year, these students are to be aware that if they wish to attend the school site for any reason, they <u>MUST</u> sign-in at the front office. Visiting other students at the College during the recess and lunch breaks is <u>NOT</u> permitted.

HAND FOOT AND MOUTH DISEASE

It is an infectious disease spread by airborne or droplets (coughing, sneezing ect) and symptoms include fever, and blisters on the hand, feet or mouth. There have been some isolated cases of hand foot and mouth disease in our school confirmed by the Doctors. Infected children need to remain away from school as long as fluid remains in the blisters once crusted over they may return. Children that come into contact do not need to be excluded from school unless symptoms above appear. Unfortunately there is no vaccine available and you can get it more than once. Remember to maintain good hand washing practises to reduce the transmission. *School Health Nurse- Rebecca Waye*



2020 SCHOLARSHIPS

Secondary schooling scholarships are now open for applications through the Department's website. A range of scholarships are on offer, including scholarships for students who:

- •attend a country school; or
- •attend a Perth public school; or live in the Fremantle area; or
- •attend Cannington Community College, Kent St SHS or Como Secondary College.

Our scholarships support studies in all years of secondary school, with most open to students currently completing Year 10 or 11 who intend to go on to complete the WACE. In addition, students currently in Years 6 - 9 at your school may be eligible for one of the two specific scholarships below:

• James and Rose Coombe Scholarships for regional and remote students. A number of these scholarships are available each year and successful applicants can reapply in subsequent years. The funding amount starts at \$1 000.

Maud Zervos Education Grants for students with a parent/caregiver who has a disability related to spinal or limb paralysis or limb loss. A 'rollover clause' in this scholarship makes funding available for every year of secondary study, subject to satisfactory progress. The funding amount starts at \$750 in lower secondary and rises to \$1 000 for upper secondary studies.

Applications for our scholarships close at 5.30pm on Thursday 12 December 2019.

MAUD ZERVOS EDUCATION GRANTS-APPLY NOW FOR 2020

Do you know a student in Year 6, 7, 8, 9, 10 or 11 this year whose parent or caregiver has lost a limb or uses a wheel chair?

Alinea (formerly the Spine and Limb Foundation of WA) funds a number of generous grants each year for students in families where a parent/caregiver has permanent spinal or limb paralysis or limb loss. Imagine how much it could help families if they were to gain a grant.

Funding is \$750 per year for lower-secondary students and \$1 000 per year for upper-secondary students. Eligible families can receive funding of up to \$5 000 over their child's secondary schooling years.
