Hello Merredin College Family

MORNING DROP-OFFS AND PICK-UP (PRIMARY)

Drop off and pick up have run very smoothly this week, but with more students returning to school next week we have decided to have a staggered pick up at the end of the day as recommended by the Australian Health Protection Principal Committee. A big thank you to our EAs and teachers who have helped each morning and afternoon this week — with escorting and supervising — to make this process so smooth and easy.

At the start of Week 2, we will be starting a staggered finish time to manage congestion. We have about 60% of primary students back at school now and expect to have most students back next week.

- Teachers will release students with Surnames A-J at 2.50pm and they will be available for pick up from this time.
- All other students, and those with secondary siblings, will be released at 3.00pm.
- Students will wait at the top of the 'Kiss and Drop' ramp for pick up and be directed down to parents by school staff.
- Parents of children that use car seats will be welcome to pull in to parking but we encourage all other parents to drive through and pick up at the ramp.
- Parents have been advised that they may need to loop through the car park and Throssell Road a few times.

This process may require some parents to loop through the car park and Throssell Road. Pick up changes have worked well so far students collected and off site by 3.10pm. We appreciate your support to help us implement these guidelines to keep our staff and students safe.

LATE STUDENTS AND COLLECTION OF STUDENTS DURING THE DAY Primary

Students who arrive late to school will need to sign in through the main office on Woolgar Avenue and will be directed or escorted to the primary part of the campus. Parents who need to collect students during the day will also have to register at the main office and students will be sent up for pick up. We apologise for the inconvenience this may cause but these changes are based on advice from the Australian Health Protection Principal Committee.

Secondary

Students are to continue signing in/out through Student Services, however this office is restricted to students only for the moment. If you wish to collect your child throughout the day please go to the main office or notify administration via phone or send your child with a signed permission note.

CANTEEN

Our P&C Canteen is up and running for Term 2 but for pre-orders only. Primary students will need to place their orders in through the baskets provided in the classroom in the morning and there will be no window sales. Parents of students in early childhood classes are asked to put orders in communication books. We will send home order bags to Primary students next week, additional bags can be requested through communication books. Secondary students are asked to drop off orders as early as possible as fresh items will be limited.
