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# Message from the Principal......

Hello Merredin College Family

I hope everyone has had an enjoyable and productive week.

Last night the College Board met for the second time this year. It was an important meeting with our Business Plan endorsed for 2020-2022. While the plan is a working document of the school, it will be made available to the school community, via hard copy in the front office and online with a link from our school webpage. The plan will be available at the start of next semester. In a productive meeting a snappy new jacket for those in the volleyball program was also approved.

Preparing for the meeting gave me time to reflect on just how busy the year has been. It has been a year unlike any other in education and it is important that we reflect as a college and see the experience as one that we can learn from and be better prepared if we need to act again. As a college we have reflected on the response to remote learning and the challenges parents have faced in supporting their children with instruction and access to materials. For many this has been significant. I am however, very excited to see further restrictions lifted allowing students to attend school camps and travel in school vehicles for excursions. As the new 'school normal' emerges please be assured that the college has daily cleaning of high touch surfaces in place and promotes excellent personal hygiene.

I was excited to see that federal government will fund an extra 39,000 university places by 2023 in a package that will restructure the amounts students have to pay for courses to encourage them to "make more job-relevant choices". Those opting for teaching and nursing would pay 46% less for their degree while a degree in agriculture would be 62% less. These are often pathways for regional students and help define course selection. It is important that through counselling processes students understand graduates from more vocationally-oriented degrees have higher employment rates. For example, those from engineering, education, health, management and commerce and information technology have rates above 75%.

This year we have 18 students on an ATAR pathway and I'm thrilled to say 9 students have already been offered university positions for 2021.
