# Message from the Principal ......

Hello Merredin College Family

The first phase of the Telethon Kids Institute DETECT Program has been completed. Approximately 150 tests were administered to staff and students over two days with minimum disruption to the college. I'd like to thank Bev Irving and Bec Wade for masterfully coordinating this somewhat unusual school activity. Feedback about student participation has been very positive. All data and any parent contact will be managed by Health WA.

The staff at the college have just completed the first reporting cycle. With the regular attendance of many students being lower over this time, the breadth and depth of the curriculum covered throughout Semester 1 has been reduced. For this reason, schools are not required to include A to E grades on this year's Semester 1 student reports. It also means that your child's attendance may not be reported, and any written comments may provide less information on their progress than usual. If a teacher has requested an interview I strongly encourage all parents to take the opportunity.

A focus at the college next semester will be to positively re-engage a group of senior students who have struggled to meet assessment deadlines and other school work requirements. We do understand that this is a completely different year for all students having lost important school events and the routine of winter sport however, it does offer an opportunity to develop resilience and grit when faced with difficult circumstances. The college will look to increase communication with students at critical points of the term and engage with parents.

Late last week I met with Regional Executive Director Neil Darby to discuss the first semester and our journey through COVID-19. It was a wide ranging conversation with Neil highlighting positive feedback that he had received about the college and commitment to students. At the end of the meeting he offered a significant sum of money to kick start strategic professional learning connected to our new business plan. With the money I have targeted whole staff development around Positive Behaviours in School and the use of evidence based teaching strategies. As the funds have come late it has forced a date change for next term. *Please note that students will now commence Term 3 on <u>Monday, 20 July</u>. The School Development Day has been moved to <u>Monday, 17 August</u>, this will be a Pupil Free day.* 

Thank you for your continued support and encouragement as we work together to provide the best learning opportunities for our students. As we progress, I'll be sure to keep you updated with any new information.
