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Message from the Principal

Earlier in the week Premier Mark McGowan released the WA Recovery Plan which aims to guide and coordinate economic and social recovery across the State. I expect all sectors of education to benefit over the next couple of years. Hopefully this is the first step in getting things back to the 'new normal' now that we have been able to begin the recovery as a state. It is important to remember however, as we have seen in Victoria, that a second wave can spring up on us at any time if we become complacent so please be sure to maintain social distancing and good hand hygiene practices. It is also important that children, and staff stay at home if they are unwell. Children will continue to be sent home from school if they present with any cold like symptoms including a runny nose, sore throat, coughing and sneezing.

It is probably also worth mentioning to both students and parents to be aware of one another as we start the new term. Students on bikes should stop and walk across roads and keep left at all times. Parents in cars need to ensure they abide by the 40km/h speed limit and remain aware of pedestrians and cyclists. For the last week or so I have been monitoring the traffic at the intersection of Woolgar Avenue and Throssell Road as I see this as a risk for the school. I will seek further advice on how we can make this complex intersection safer. With the recent tragic accident of a young boy on a bike near Mandurah I'd like to remind parents that the peripheral vision of a young person isn't fully developed until the age of twelve and that adult supervision is strongly recommended for children riding or scooting on footpaths.

Congratulations to all secondary students recognised for high academic performance at our most recent assembly. It was also fantastic to introduce the new School Councillors and allow our outgoing leaders to hand over the flag. Through a difficult period, I'd like to acknowledge the contribution of Tom Farson, Panache Mudimu, Rebecca Nelson, Charlee Brooker, Daniella Navales and Tom Flint. Also a big thank you to Tom James for guiding our senior leaders.

I would like to thank our P&C and canteen staff for all their hard work in ensuring that our canteen has successfully operated for a majority of the year.
