SWOOPING MAGPIES DURING BREEDING SEASON

The Department of Biodiversity, Conservation and Attractions would like to remind you that the magpie breeding season is approaching or has arrived. Please find enclosed some literature for you to convey to your students.

It is not uncommon for magpies to defend their nests and young during spring, by swooping intruders. The season may last for six to eight weeks during late August to December.
