### SCHOOL GROUNDS

#### NO SCHOOL NO POOL

Merredin College has put significant effort into maintaining positive attendance statistics over many years. Using Schools Online data provided by the Department of Education, comparisons can be made to WA Public and like schools for Primary, Secondary and Aboriginal attendance. Merredin College attendance rates for all categories have been better than like schools and either marginally better or equal to WA public school averages. To improve attendance for a very small group of students the college has successfully collaborated with the shire and police to adopt a **No School No Pool** policy. As we have such positive attendance data (down this year because of the pandemic) I don't see the strategy as being punitive rather supportive for those that need an extra incentive to make it to school. As such the college will be providing attendance data to the shire to support the initiative – please note that we will take a common sense approach to this initiative.
