The new government has separated the work done by the Department of Education, Skills and Employment into:

• a stand-alone <u>Department of Education</u> to drive better outcomes through access to quality education and learning.

and

• a <u>Department of Employment and Workplace Relations</u> to *enable access to quality skills, training and employment to support Australians find secure work in fair, productive and safe workplaces* The <u>Jobs and skills Summit</u> is to be held in September. Ideas will be captured in an Employment White Paper will inform the future of Australia's employment.

Climate Change

We already know that climate change is a priority for this government. We can predict a surge in demand for skills for scientists and manufacturers needed for the creation, design, development and installation of equipment and systems that enhance our sustainable environment.

Child Care and Aged Care

BHP Pilbara Rail Academy Trainees = 70% Women 20% Aboriginal

BHP is planning to employ 200 new train drivers over the next three years.

There is a significant change in the gender balance in the train driver workforce with 70% of the trainees being female. Aboriginal workers are employed across BHP and 20% of the train driver trainees are Aboriginal.

It is a 10-month course and there was strong competition for the traineeships.


