# COVID UPDATE

Last Friday we sent out an email outlining the public health requirements regarding COVID in the Wheatbelt. I would like to thank parents for ensuring secondary students had masks and for those who complied with the requirements to wear masks when visiting classrooms.

Schools are currently operating under the Education Department Phase 5 COVID Guidelines in the school. The aim is to remain as normal as possible while maintaining the safety of those in our school. At present we are operating under the following guidelines:

- Parents are required to wear a mask whenever they are indoors within the school unless they have an exemption.
- All students in year 7-10 are required to wear a mask indoors unless they have an exemption.
- A focus on Hand hygiene and ongoing increased cleaning regimens remain in place. Masks are available for staff and students if required.
- Events and programmes such as Classroom Parent Information Sessions, Swimming lessons and carnivals, volunteering and incursions will proceed as normal unless we advise otherwise.
- Any students presenting as unwell will be isolated from others until they are picked up by parents/carers.

As of this morning schools have been advised by the Education Department to limit in-school gatherings of students and staff to class groups or small groups within a year level. All actions are aimed to minimise the number of students and staff impacted by the pressure of a positive case.

The evolving nature of the COVID-19 situation will likely result in ongoing tightening of conditions resulting in additional measures that will need to be put in place to manage the challenges ahead. We will continue to provide information to parents as we receive it and will include links to the information already sent out on the school website. I thank you in advance for your understanding and ongoing support as we navigate our way through these uncertain times. # **PRIMARY OFFICE**

The Primary Office will be manned by a school officer from 8.30-9.30am each day. The contact phone number for the Primary office is the main Merredin College phone number 9041 7520. To guarantee messages get passed on to students before the end of the day they will need to be received by the office by 2.30pm on Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday and by 2pm on Wednesday (early close).

If parents need to collect their child during the day, they can sign them out at the Compass station in the Primary Office, where they will receive a pass to give to the classroom teacher, before collecting them from class. Students cannot be released from class without a pass.

Invitations to install and update Consent2Go have been initiated. If you have not received one please also check your 'junk items' in your inbox to see if you have received the email there, otherwise please contact administration.

We ask that you please confirm our records of your son/daughter's health details are current. Information provided is valid for 12 months and authorises staff to provide care for your child.

Any permanent change/s to contact information including address change/s must also be advised in writing to Merredin College Administration as soon as possible so contact can be made in the case of any matters of urgency.

# **HEALTH CARE PLANS**

Student health care plan updates will be sent home with students within the next week. Please complete them and return to the classroom teacher or Student Services as soon as possible to ensure your child's health concerns are managed appropriately by school staff.

### **ROCK AND WATER PROGRAM**

During 2022, our chaplain Sal Marais will be working with all primary classes to present the Rock and Water program. The program will last a full term in each class and complements the social and emotional learning that teachers promote throughout each lesson.

The Rock & Water Program is well known throughout school education systems around the world since it was written in the mid 1990's. The concepts 'Rock' and 'Water' are used as a metaphor throughout the program for young people to explore and

choose different forms of communication (e.g. does the situation require a Rock attitude or Water attitude).

'Rock' explores closing off from others and going your own way while 'Water' explores going with the flow and working in partnership with other people. The skills and strategies learnt from Rock & Water support young people to learn and practice adaptable life and social skills while providing a consistent, predictable, easy to learn and retain language. There is a strong "social" focus embedded in the program. In recent evaluations and studies, it has shown the program and framework can deliver key outcomes for schools and students such as:

- To increase social wellbeing
- To teach and increase social safety for students
- To increase positive social behaviour
- To increase social competence in students
- To increase social literacy

# STUDENTS ON SCHOOL GROUNDS

Breakfast Club commences at 8.20am so no student should be at school before 8.20am. Unless attending Breakfast Club or arriving to school on a school bus, children should not be at school before 8.30am on school days. The school grounds are out of

bounds after hours and on weekends. Police complete periodic "walk throughs" in order to monitor trespassers. The school has extensive CCTV cameras to monitor out of hours' trespassers and passes this information on to the police.
