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A message from the Principal

Dear Parents and Carers and community,

With one week to go I would like to take the opportunity to thank our parents, students and community for their ongoing efforts with adhering to the Covid restrictions. Whilst there are cases in town, the impact on Merredin College to date has been minimal. This is largely due to families being proactive in isolating if deemed positive or close contacts, students wearing their masks in class and good communication between parents and the school so close contacts are identified quickly. The latest Health Department announcements have introduced more relaxed Covid rules. As such the Minister of Education has announced an easing of public health measures in schools for Term 2. Year 3-12 students will still be required to wear masks on site, however, parents will be able to attend school events such as assemblies and sports carnivals. A letter will be sent home to parents next week with updated Covid guidelines for Week 1 -Term 2.

I would like to positively acknowledge the staff and students of Merredin College. This term has been challenging in numerous ways. There has been changes in Leadership, staffing, postponement of activities, and of course Covid restrictions. SCHOOL GROUNDS

Reminder to parents/carers and students that school grounds are out of bounds to the community out of school hours. Students are to arrive at school no earlier than 8.30am and should not access playgrounds or basketball courts after school unless for a school event. We now have CCTV Cameras installed throughout the school and are able to determine people using the school as a thoroughfare after hours and on the weekends when damage does occur.

LUNCH DELIVERIES

We ask that parents dropping school lunches off throughout the day should be dropping them at either the Primary office or Student Services. Your child/ren can then collect it from the appropriate office at the beginning of lunch or recess. Carparks and out the front of the school are out of bounds to students during the school day due to safety reasons and duty of care, so please do not encourage your child/ren to access these areas when they are not supposed too.

PRIMARY ASSEMBLY

Our second primary assembly for the year will be held on Thursday, 7 April and will be run by Mrs Postans Year 5/6 Class. Due to Covid Restrictions we will be streaming the assembly live on our School Facebook Page from 9am. We are hoping to have some of the sound issues sorted for this next event.

ATTENDANCE FOLLOW UP

Attendance Follow-up letters are sent home with students fortnightly. These letters should be filled in with a reason for your Child/ren/s absences from School. It is a Department of Education requirement reasons for absence are provided and recorded on your child's attendance record. Letters should be returned to Student Services for Secondary students as soon as possible.

YEAR 7 SCHOOL BASED IMMUNISATION PROGRAM

The year 7 Vaccination Program will be happening early in Term 2. Parent consent forms have been handed out this week and will need to be handed back to student services by Friday, 8 April. The program provides protection against several diseases and will be provided onsite at the College. The program commences with two vaccinations in Term 2 and then the last vaccination in Term 3 or 4. The consent form provides written information about the diseases and you can consent to both vaccinations on the one form. NAPLAN EXEMPTIONS AND WITHDRAWALS

Year 3, 5, 7 and 9 students will be undertaking NAPLAN Online in Term 2 between the 10-20 May. Students with significant intellectual disability and/or those with significant co-existing conditions which severely limit their capacity to participate in the tests may be exempted from sitting the tests.

Students who have been attending school in Australia for less than a year before the tests may also be eligible for exemption. Exemptions should be discussed with your child's classroom teacher.

Parents or carers may withdraw their child from the tests to address issues such as religious beliefs and philosophical objections to testing. It is recommended that withdrawal be considered in consultation with your child's teacher.


All requests for exemption from testing or withdrawal from testing must be received by the school by Friday, 29 April. Exemption and Withdrawal Forms can be collected from primary administration or through Student Services.

Asymptomatic close contact protocols

Very high caseload settings

Students in school or early childcare, who have been identified as a close contact but are asymptomatic:



Can attend school, before school care and after school care



Can travel between home and school with family – avoid public transport unless no alternative available



Can attend school-based sporting, cultural training or school events at their school



Must isolate at all other times until 7 days has passed.

If students become unwell, they should stay at home and get tested.

These settings do not apply to students who are household close contacts – in this case, students will need to isolate for seven days and follow the regular close contact protocols.
