A message from the Principal

Dear parents/carers

The extreme heat earlier this week has taken its toll with a number of very tired primary school children and staff completing their final sessions of swimming lessons. It was terrific to see Mrs Low's Year 1/2 class perform at the first primary school assembly on Thursday and Mrs Adamson got everyone involved in an animated music item.

This week we welcomed Mr Paul Morris into the English/HASS teaching position in secondary. We also welcomed another 7 new students between primary and secondary. It is fantastic to have so many new students and families move to Merredin.

Earlier this week a couple of students displayed some appalling aggressive behaviour. Violence is not an acceptable way to manage your emotions and will not be condoned. The Education Department has a clear stance on not tolerating violence in schools or the use of devices to video and/or distribute images of fighting or other acts of aggression. The maximum penalty for both acts is 10 days suspension. Please support the school by encouraging your children to use appropriate methods of conflict resolution and comply with the Mobile Phone policy (no phone use between 8.50am – 3.00pm). The school will be working with the Merredin Police, School Nurse, Youth groups and community organisations to deliver curriculum related to a variety of issues throughout the year ie., cyberbullying, alcohol/drug awareness, relationships, personal development and hygiene etc.

On Tuesday the P&C hosted a Sundowner Meet and Greet and the swimming pool. It was terrific to see so many students and parents enjoying a swim and a free sausage sizzle. Next Tuesday the P&C will be hold their Annual General Meeting 6pm Wahlsten Library.

OLNA TESTING

Testing for the standard achievement levels in both numeracy and literacy will be held over the next few weeks. These are very important tests and should be taken seriously by students and it's highly advised that students **do not** miss the testing window. Students who do not pass these tests will result in not attaining their Western Australian Certificate of Education (WACE) at the completion of Year 12. AHEAD (Addressing Higher Education Access Disadvantage Program)




SEESAW LEARNING PORTFOLIOS (K-6)

Seesaw is a simple way for teachers and students to record and share what's happening in the classroom. Seesaw gives students a place to document their learning, be creative and learn how to use technology. Each student gets their own journal and will add things to it, like photos, videos, drawings, or notes. When there are new Seesaw posts, families can be notified via app notification, email or SMS. Parents are only notified about their own child's work, and all data is safe and secure.

Year 3 – 6 students attending the carnival has been restricted to those students who are able to confidently swim 25m. Permission notes were sent home Thursday for Primary students. Unfortunately, the number of students meeting this milestone has fallen over recent years, reducing participation in the carnival however we do have to put the safety of our students first.
