A message from the Principal

This term is a Reporting term so please have a conversation with your child/ren about doing the best they can so the reports are a true reflection of their capabilities. Ensuring your child has all the necessary resources for class will support the teachers. It is important that teachers and parents communicate regularly to ensure every opportunity is afforded for your child to do well. Please feel free to contact the school to arrange a time to meet with the classroom teacher if you have any concerns.

The start of the term is a perfect time to reinforce classroom expectations. The following has been reinforced to Teachers in order to support optimal conditions for learning in the classroom.

Start of the lesson:

- a clear seating plan.
- students are greeted at the door and ensure they go into class in a calm and orderly manner.
- there is a DO Now activity on the board (or PowerPoint) so students are engaged and quiet whilst the role is marked.
- every lesson has a Learning Intention and students know the Success Criteria for the lesson.
- As per Education Department expectations, students are not to use their mobile phones in class for any reason unless under the direct guidance of the classroom teacher.

End of the lesson:

- lesson is summarised and students are informed what they will be doing next lesson.
- the classroom is clean and tidy with equipment packed away.
- students move out of the classroom in a calm and orderly manner.

Changes to Student Services – a reminder that secondary students who need to pay for events, arrive late or need to leave early, or are unwell and need to go home will do so now via the Administration office on Woolgar Ave. The Student Wellbeing Hub (formerly Student Services) will still triage and manage at risk students.

Our primary focus will be to continue to support all students in particular those students who may need some additional support and someone to speak with. As the new team develops, current processes will be reviewed and refined, and new processes may be developed. Parents and students will be informed how they can utilise this team if seeking support.
