Textbooks

Extra Cost Options

In addition to subject contributions and charges there are additional charges for:

- (a) optional activities in any course for which there is a cost associated with their provision such as camps and excursions.
- (b) other optional school-based activities which address broad learning outcomes, school and social events such as graduation dinners or school balls.
- (c) optional purchase or other school-based items such as leavers jumpers, specialist school uniform and the school magazine Combined Harvest.

Participation in optional activities is voluntary but a compulsory charge is applied if a student elects to participate. Payment will be requested during the school year when costs and participation by students is confirmed.

It is unlikely that all these items will occur in any one year. Please note Year 7 electives which are largely practical subjects are mandatory taster units and will not incur additional material charges.

The follow pages have identified possible extra cost options for 2024 for the year 7 cohort. The prescribed amount does not take into consideration fundraising opportunities which may reduce the cost of some camps and excursions.

BYOD Program

BYOD (Bring your Own Device) refers to students bringing a personally owned device to school for the purpose of learning.

- Device is to be no older than 4 years old
- Screen Size should be no bigger than 15 Inches
- Devices must have keyboard capabilities
- Devices must support 5GHZ Dual Band 802.11a/b/g/n wireless
- Battery Life of the device must last the day (no recharge available)
- All required software or applications must be preloaded
- BYOD Use agreement must be signed
- Students must abide by the School Electronic Device Policy
- Merredin College does not take responsibility for any loss or damage and encourages parents to consider device insurance.

In addition to the original BYOD program in 2024 Merredin College is requesting that Year 7 students participate in a full cohort BYOD Plan. Laptops will need to meet specific requirements to be connected to the school network.
