


Absent students will have an opportunity to 'catch up' on incomplete assessment(s) during 12th-14th May.

COMPASS ORDERING SYSTEM

We recommend you add this to your Newsletter before photo day, to advise Parents /Guardians of ordering procedures

School Photos will be taken on:

Monday 5th and Tuesday 6th of May 2025

O Class Photos/Portraits:

- Every Student will have their photo taken, whether they are purchasing photos or not.
- Online orders for Individual photos and Class group photos can only be placed via the Compass Portal.
- The expirydate for online ordering is Tuesday 13th of May 2025
- Any orders received after this date will incur an archive fee of \$30.
- Spare envelopes (green) will be available at the school reception should you wish to pay via cash.

O Specialty Group Photos:

After photo day, a link will be sent to the School for distribution to parents whose child/children is/are in the specialty group photos.

O Family Photos:

- Family photos are taken each morning before school.
- Family orders can be placed online via the Compass Portal or by collecting a family (orange) envelope from School Reception
- Online orders for Family photos are cut off at midnight the day prior to the first photo day.
- If you are using a family envelope with payment enclosed, please ensure this is handed to the photographers at the time of the photo.
- Once the photos are delivered the family photos will remain at reception for parents to collect.

Ordering through the Compass portal:

- 1. Click the MSP Photography link in the Compass App
- 2. Select 'Order 2025 Photographs'
- 3. Choose your pack then place your order

Ordering with Cash payment:

- 2. Fill in the front of the envelope with your child's details and shootkey
- 3. Place cash in the envelope and seal
- 4. Hand envelope with payment enclosed to the Photographer on photo day

WA Student Assistance payment (WASAP)

As announced by the Premier and Minister for Education, the second round of the WASAP is now available for every eligible student in Western Australia to provide cost-of-living relief for families to help with the cost of children's schooling.

All enrolled WA school students are eligible for the payment of \$250 for each secondary student and \$150 for primary and kindergarten students.

Families will be able to claim using the information from the 2024 initiative.
