Principal's Address

2026 Teaching Staff

With availability of teachers being low across Australia, recruitment of teaching staff is an ongoing activity for our school.

I am pleased to share that we have successfully attracted the following teachers to join our team in 2026.

Jenae will be visiting our school next week with Melani arriving in town next year. Zoe and Emma are local to our school.

Despite advertising throughout the year, we have not found a suitable applicant for the vacant Design and Technologies teacher position. We know how important practical subjects such as Design and Technologies is for our students and therefore have partnered once again with School of Distance and Isolated Education (SIDE) to offer Woodwork and Technical Engineering for Year 7-12 in 2026. Students should be proud of the high quality observed in their work this year. I have seen significant in improvement in the standard of work.

We will continue to seek a *quality* Design and Technologies teacher for our school.

Holidays/vacations during the School Term

We understand that from time-to-time families may need to travel during the school term. Whilst we discourage in-term family holidays we do value receiving advance notification of student absences.

- Where holidays/vacations are notified in advance and are of 5 or less days, the absence will be recorded as an *Authorised Vacation*.
- Where advance notification has not been provided or the vacation is longer than 5
 days without approval of the Principal, the absence will be recorded as an
 Unauthorised Vacation.

Although teaching staff are not expected to provide work when students are away on holidays or for other voluntary absences, we do encourage students to discuss this absence directly with their teacher(s) to ensure they understand upcoming learning and assessments.

We appreciate your support in planning future family vacations during scheduled school holiday periods wherever possible, as this supports student learning and attendance consistency across the school.

Social Media Age Restrictions

From 10 December 2025, many social media platforms won't be allowed to let children under the age of 16 create or keep a social media account. This will include:

- Instagram
- Kick
- <u>Reddit</u>
- Snapchat
- <u>Threads</u>

- <u>TikTok</u>
- <u>Twitch</u>
- X (formerly Twitter)
- <u>YouTube</u>

Social media companies will seek information about if the person ordinarily live in Australia, and if the person is over the age of 16. It's important to know that age-restricted platforms can no longer just rely on a user providing a birthdate at account sign up. The platforms are expected to have ways to stop users faking their age using false identity documents, AI tools or deepfakes. They are also expected to try to stop under-16s from using VPNs to pretend to be outside Australia.

There are many ways that social media companies might check a person's age. Check out the eSafety Website for more information.

2026 SECONDARY ASSISTANCE SCHEME

The Secondary Assistance Scheme is available to secondary students whose parents hold a concession card. The scheme includes the Clothing Allowance (\$115 paid to school or parent) and Educational Program Allowance (\$235 paid directly to the school).


If you think you are eligible for the Secondary Assistance Scheme, you are able to apply through the school at the beginning of next year.

The Secondary Assistance Scheme is available to students up to and including the year in which they turn 18, and only if they have a parent who is a holder of one of the prescribed cards listed below:

- · Centrelink Pensioner Concession Card; or
- Centrelink Health Care Card (Family card only not for a specific child for medical purposes, viz: "CDA" type [Child Disability Allowance]); or
- Department of Veterans' Affairs Pensioner Concession Card.
- Cards that are not eligible are TPI and Gold Cards.

Students in receipt of ABSTUDY are eligible for the Secondary Assistance Scheme.

Congratulations to all the Primary students for completing the Jump Rope for Heart skipping program. Our fundraising total was \$9,107 for the Heart Foundation


